In early September, we held our first neighborhood watch meeting, and it was extremely successful. Deputy Martinez from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office spoke about crime in our area and some prevention steps we can take to eliminate or defend ourselves from it occurring. We discovered that as part of creating a neighborhood watch program, we would be provided two neighborhood watch signs, with each additional sign costing \$30. We are currently in the process of establishing the cost to purchase more signs, posts, and the materials necessary to install them. GAS TAX PROPOSAL: Our Questions Need Answers

Brevard County commissioners recently agreed to conduct workshops to re-analyze the county budget and to determine the best approach to finding more money for repair and maintenance of our roads, rather than immediately approving Commissioner Barfield's proposal to raise local gas taxes by 6 cents per gallon. The decision came at the end of a three-hour commission meeting during which 35 people addressed the commissioners. Twenty-six spoke against raising the gas tax. About 100 other people listened to the debate.

Under this proposal, the gas tax increase would run for a period of ten years, unless extended by the County Commission and the municipalities. The County could also rescind the tax at any time within the ten years. Increasing the gas tax would require the approval of four out of five commissioners, a super-majority. Commissioners voted to come up with solutions by February 1st.

The Florida Department of Revenue notes that motorists throughout Florida pay statewide fuel taxes of 28.525 cents per gallon. There are additional state taxes, fees, local option and motor fuel taxes, and Brevard currently collects 6 cents per gallon of local option gas tax, which was imposed in 1986. That tax has raised about \$9 million a year for the county during the county's 2012, 2013 and 2014 budget years. Of that, an average of about \$6 million per year is being used to pay off debt on previous road improvements. So, nearly 2/3 of the total amount collected goes to pay off debt previously incurred and is not expended directly to repair and maintain roads. The proposed tax is expected to generate an estimated \$7.8 million a year for Brevard County and about \$3.8 million for Brevard municipalities.

Serious Tax Questions: While we understand there are different "funding pots" for new road construction and repair/maintenance, the following tax questions must be properly answered prior to any decision-making.

- 1) Annual Budget: If road repair and maintenance are urgently needed, why didn't the commissioners deal with this issue during the recent county budget cycle that was concluded in September? Now, this is being promoted as an urgent need without having rigorously assessed the budget.
- 2) Transportation Impact Fees: Over many years, transportation impact fees on new construction have been assessed and collected by Brevard County in relationship to new growth. When the question about ending the transportation impact fee moratorium came up, one that was put in place because of the economic

downturn and which was set to expire on December 31, 2014, why did the commissioners vote to continue this moratorium on new construction? Instead, of identifying the road repair and maintenance issue as a critical need, they voted to extend the moratorium on the collection of these fees. One major developer with whom I have spoken stated that his company is in favor of these impact fees as a means to help pay for the legitimate costs of new growth. And while the costs are passed onto new home buyers, the costs are amortized or spread over many years over the mortgage payments.

- 3) Debt: If the county instituted the additional gas tax, how much of it would be allocated toward debt? Currently, about 2/3 of the revenue collected on the current gas tax is allocated toward paying off debt on previous improvements.
- 4) Fuel Costs: While the lower cost of gasoline has reduced tax revenue to the county and cities, what happens when the cost of fuel rises? Consumers would

be adversely impacted, but the county and cities will reap a windfall in comparison. Can we count on our county government to reduce or eliminate this tax under these circumstances?

- 5) Regressive Tax: The gas tax is paid for by all who purchase gasoline, visitors and residents alike. It can be termed a type of user-tax. However, the extreme negative is that it is a regressive tax because it hits the less well-off individuals much harder and takes a larger share of their earnings, which they can ill afford.
- 6) Property Taxes: If the commissioners don't want to tax new construction/growth with transportation impact fees, and they don't institute a gas tax, how else can road repairs be funded? They can be funded through our property taxes. We taxpayers currently pay an ad valorem tax on the November tax bill under the taxing authority for Road & Bridge in District 4. In 2015, the millage rate was decreased by the commission, bringing in less dollars for roads on many homestead, protected

properties. If our roads are considered legitimate needs rather than wants, then why weren't the budget and related contracts critically examined to ensure that roads are properly funded and that those revenues are properly expended, while incurring only a reasonable amount of debt?

NO PARKING" ON SIDEWALKS: It's the Law

Parking on a public sidewalk is a legitimate safety issue about which residents are concerned. Florida State Law Section 316.1945 and Brevard County Code of Ordinances Section 106-31 prohibit parking in specified places. Both state law and county law prohibit parking a vehicle over public sidewalks, which are public right of way. This is a safety issue during the day, but it becomes an even more serious safety issue at night, even downright dangerous, as some sidewalks are regularly blocked.

This comment is from an Area 5 resident: "Recently

we walked early in the evening, and 5 or 6 houses had multiple vehicles parked blocking the sidewalk; we had to walk in the street (there was no party or anything special going on). Since it had rained recently, we were way out in the middle of the street."

Common sense tells us that parking on sidewalks can be a serious safety issue for children, as they often ride their bikes along sidewalks; and if the sidewalks are obstructed, then these children must enter the roadway in order to avoid these illegally parked vehicles. In addition, there could be liability issues for those who park on the sidewalks, if an accident occurs because someone had to walk in the roadway.

Jurisdiction and enforcement of the law resides with the Brevard County Sheriff's Department. Please rearrange the vehicles on your driveway to follow the law and to accommodate residents who use our sidewalks. And remember not to block the roadway as well, so that emergency vehicles can reach their destination.



BREVARD COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

(1) Brevard County Seeks citizen Input Through "Speak Up Brevard": In an effort to provide a formal process for citizens to submit recommendations to Brevard county government, and as a result of a charter amendment, the county is implementing a web-based application called "Speak Up Brevard". An online form will be available beginning December 1st through December 31st at www.brevarcounty.us. This will allow residents to submit ideas which could assist the county in conserving energy, saving costs, eliminating duplication, generating revenue, increasing productivity, and preventing waste. A hard-copy version is also available through the county manager's office. The county manager has 45 days in which to evaluate and comment on the recommendations and forward it to the commission for their review. The board must make a decision regarding each submitted recommendation within 120 days. You may access the online form at www.brevarcounty.us, where you can

click on E-Government and the category titled "Provide Feedback." Recommendations can be posted under the "Speak Up Brevard" heading.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

The St. Johns River Water Management District's watering restrictions are designed to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation. The restrictions allow enough water to maintain healthy landscapes year-round. The mandatory restrictions specify the time when watering may occur, the amount of water that should be applied, and the days when watering may occur. These days depend on whether the address ends in an odd or even number, and on the time of year.

Summary of Restrictions:

During Daylight Saving Time (second Sunday in March until the first Sunday in November), irrigation is limited to no more than two days per week on scheduled days. Residential irrigation is allowed on Wednesday and Saturday at addresses ending in odd numbers or no address. Residential irrigation is allowed on Thursday and Sunday at addresses ending in even numbers.

During Eastern Standard Time (first Sunday in November until the second Sunday in March), Saturday (odd) and

Sunday (even) are the designated irrigation days.

- Water only when needed, and not between 10 am and 4 pm.
- Water for no more than one hour per zone. Irrigation is limited to no more than ¾ inch of water per zone per irrigation day.
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water and water from public and private utilities.
